"The key provider elements of our model strengthen one another," said Dr. Bruce Kutinsky, CEO, Access Infusion Care. "When nurses develop long-term relationships with patients, they can uncover issues that might otherwise go unaddressed. Our pharmacists, embedded within the communities we serve, collaborate closely with our nursing team and liaise with treating physicians to ensure safe, effective therapy management."

Unlike traditional infusion models where pharmacists operate behind the scenes, Access Infusion Care integrates pharmacists as patient-facing clinicians. They conduct comprehensive medication reviews, educate patients on infusion and complementary therapies, identify adherence risks, and communicate directly with prescribing providers. This role is central to the model's effectiveness and its commitment to improved patient outcomes.

Access Infusion Care's nurses deliver ongoing case management and continuity of care. Whenever possible, each patient is paired with a consistent nurse who administers therapy, monitors clinical status, assesses for complications, provides education on self-care and adherence, and coordinates with the broader care team. Because infusion visits occur over multiple hours and repeated encounters, this

sustained relationship fosters trust, supports deeper symptom evaluation, and enables early identification of clinical changes.

## **A Reinforced Model Built on Continuity and Community**

Emerging evidence continues to highlight a powerful and interdependent framework for improving outcomes among rural patients with chronic conditions: sustained continuity of care, proactive nurse case management, and active engagement of pharmacists embedded in the communities they serve.

Access Infusion Care's model reflects these reinforcing elements in practice.

- **Continuity of Care** allows infusion nurses to build trusted relationships with patients over time, encouraging open conversations about adherence barriers, side effects, and evolving clinical needs.
